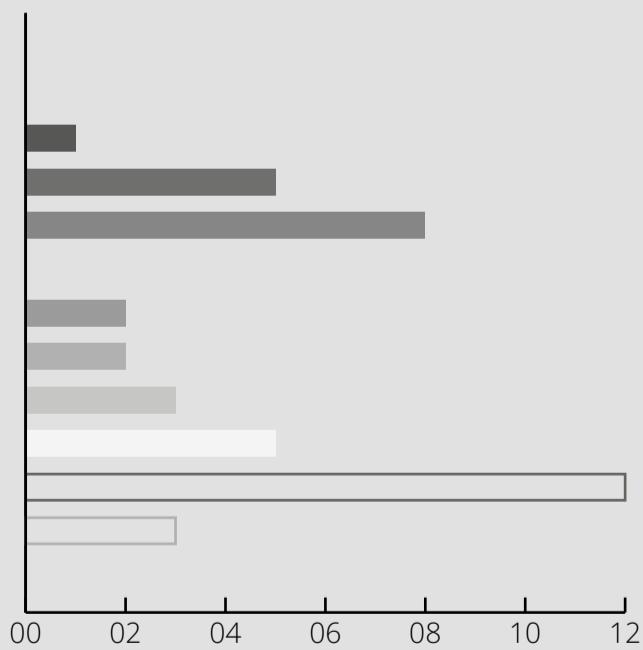
- 27 Walking: To leave at least 1 meter for pedestrian walkways (includes streetscape & in-between buildings)

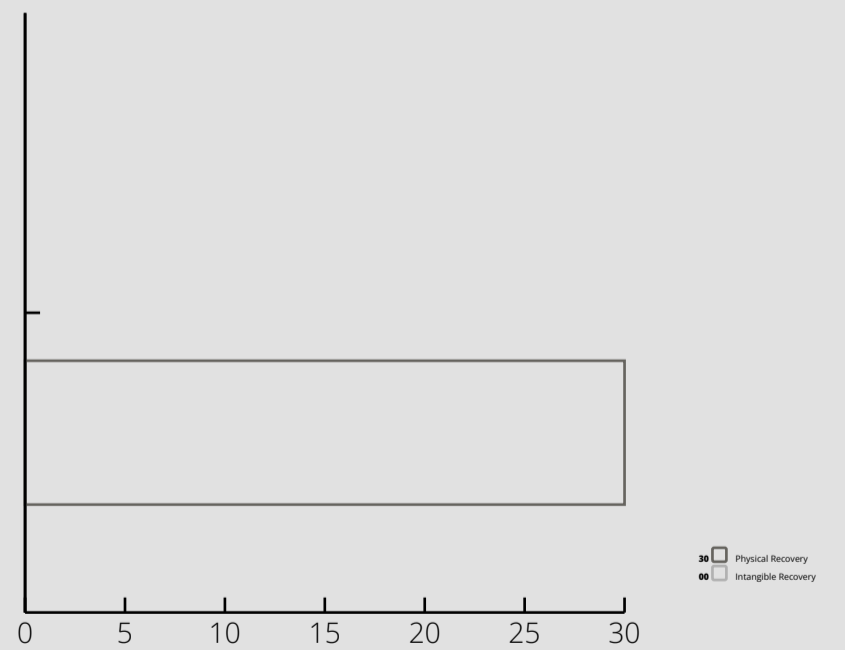
